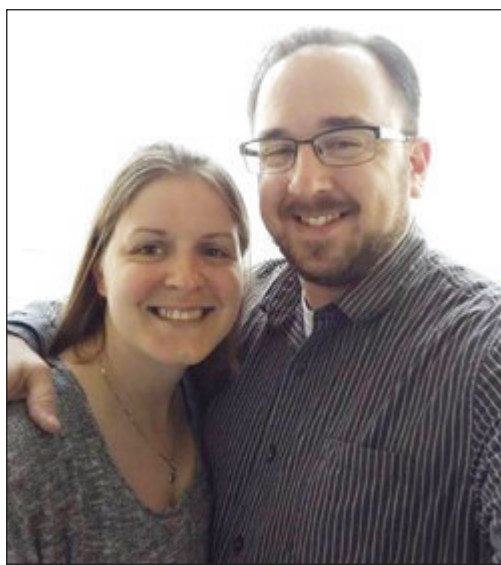

the limits of my expressive abilities." Says Thomas Paquette of Boltax, "her mastery is remarkable. She not only captures a lively likeness of her subject, but they are masterfully done with the paint being just as expressive as the person's face."

Also opening an exhibition at the Cray on Nov. 19 is Nicole Renee Ryan.

Ryan, a contemporary watercolorist, oil painter, and muralist out of Mercer, Pa., works in Pittsburgh, where she was nominated for Pittsburgh Emerging Artist of the year for 2016. Ryan is a self-taught artist who majored in Psychology with a minor in Professional Writing at Washington & Jefferson University, in Washington, Pa., earning her degree there. She has also been awarded a residency at the New York Art Student's League at Vytlacil and a fellowship at the Virginia Center for Creative Arts. Ryan has been featured in a newly released book of watercolors by north Light Books, Splash 15: Texture.

Ryan's collection, Everywhere and Nowhere, is a collection of portraits from memory, aiming not to reveal or evoke an accurate reproduction of a place, but rather to embrace the latent meaning of places as they are imprinted in our minds. Says Ryan in her artist's statement, she started out painting portraits and had little interest in landscape. After pursuing her degree in Psychology, however, she became curious about why people are as they are. "It (Psychology) was similar to portraiture in that there were many nuances that overall made a picture of a person. However, what I became interested in explor-

ing more, was less the descriptive traits and more what is it that makes us an individual and what is it about that that ties us to our common humanity."

According to the exhibition page on the Cray Gallery's website, "Landscapes become metaphor. Clouds and weather become mood and personality. Light and color shift and move to become a simple description of time when seen subtly changing over multiple paintings."

The exhibition website goes on to say that "though the memories are misremembered, wrong, overly romantic or tragic and are defined as much by what is missing by what is present," the greater universal truth is revealed by embracing that "inaccuracy."

Says Ryan in her statement, "When I am successful, viewers will feel like the landscape was part of their story. They were there, they saw it, even if they are not able to tell where or when."

Says Paquette of the exhibition, "both artists are very much into psychology and the human spirit. Ryan focuses on how the landscape affects our perceptions and moods, and Boltax portrays the person and character behind the portraits. For as different as these shows (one of portraits, one of landscapes) are, I don't think we could have paired them better with anyone else, they both use human conscious as their starting point."

The new exhibition opens at 6 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 19, with ukelele music being provided by Mark and Elissa Davis and Gary Brumagin from 6 to 7 p.m. Artists' gallery talks will begin at 7, and the show runs through Saturday, Dec. 10.
